1989 Ride Statistics

CSCC held 188 scheduled rides in 1989. Single day rides ranged in distances from 10 to 130 miles. The longest ride was TOARV-89 a two day event of 190 miles. CSCC rides totaled 5,540 miles for an average ride of 29.5 miles with an average of six participants. Ride participation ranged from one rider to 50 riders on TOARV-89. Our first organized century "OYO Centuries" had 28 participants. Club members logged over 32,000 club miles in 1989. Several thousand miles were logged by club members who participated in other organized rides. One member rode self-supported from Colorado Springs to Dallas and another rode from Washington, DC to Parsons, Kansas.

Proposed Changes to the Club's Mileage Point System

The CSCC Ride Point System is now in its second year. The program started as an incentive program to encourage members to participate in club rides. There have been a few recommendations to change the program for 1990.

Bill Rewerts has suggested that we keep separate records for ride leaders and participants. Each rider will receive one point for each CSCC scheduled ride they complete. Ride leaders will receive one ride point and one ride leader point for each ride. CSCC members could then receive monthly and annual awards based upon the number of rides they have completed or lead.

The current system was purposed by our president Bob Smith. This system is currently based on actual club miles ridden with a few exceptions. There are monthly double point rides that are published in the newsletter, which are selected by the club's president. Currently, all ride leaders receive double points for all rides lead with the exception of double point rides where they receive the same number of points as other riders. All off-road or mountain bike miles are double points for difficulty (only those miles actually ridden off-road). Additionally, ride support personnel receive mile points equal to those of the actual ride participants.

Currently, awards are presented annually at the Club's Awards Dinner in December. Trophies have been presented to the top four or five club riders and certificates of participation to all riders who have accumulated 500 or more ride points during the year.

Bob Smith recommends that we modify the existing program to keep ride leader mile points separate from actual ride points. Continue to have one or two bonus point rides per month and also award support persons ride points and continue double points for off-road miles. He would also like to expand the award system to award certificates for mileage milestones and recognize both a male and female riders and ride leaders of the month in the newsletter.

If you have any ideas on this issue, present to Bob Smith in writing or bring them to next business meeting. This will be an agenda item for the next business meeting. In the meantime records will be kept so that either of the above methods can be implemented.
